Bijou Tales of Theatre Folk

It is the long hot summer of 76 and I was the Stage Manager for the Black and White Minstrels on the Brittania pier in Great Yarmouth.

The Stage Manager was required to be smartly dressed, I worked at the time for Bob Luff and he liked you in a bow tie. I was wearing the tie, but being in a hot theatre with a tin roof, apart from the tie all I was wearing was a pair of pinstripe swimming shorts.



Lenny Henry was on stage when the theatre manager appeared at my side. He informed me that we had received a credible bomb threat, which later turned out to be a hoax, and that we had to evacuate.

Normally the Company Manager in a DJ would make the announcement. Unfortunately we shared a manager with the 'Little and Large' show in the ABC up the road and he could normally be found in a small tavern about half way between the two theatres.

In his absence I told the Theatre Manager that he would have to do it as he was already dressed for the part but he started shaking, went very pale before telling me that he could not go on in front of all those people.

So dressed in my dicki bow and trunks on I go in front of 1500 people. Unfortunately a very young and exuberant Mr. Henry thinks it's a wind up and I have to shout in his ear to explain the gravity of the situation.



So we spent the next hour with the Minstrels, Mitchell Maids, Keith Harris, (I hate that duck), Lenny Henry and the Three Monarchs, (If you remember them you are showing your age), standing on a set of wheeled trolleys entertaining 1500 people and quite a few passersby on Great Yarmouth sea front. Thank god it was second house. We needed a few stiff G & T's that night
